



I, Walter D Bishop do swear that on or about November 1966 I boarded a contract commercial flight at Travis AFB. My final destination was to be Bangkok, Thailand but the flight I was on first flew to Anchorage, AK then Yokota, Japan, then Saigon, Vietnam where we all had to deplane. We were allowed to go into the PX and purchase whatever items wanted while the plane was serviced. We then boarded again and flew on to Bangkok, Thailand. At this destination I was billeted in a downtown hotel and the next day we were flown to Ubon, Thailand by C-130 where I served for one year.

On another occasion around March 1967, I was injured while drilling some heavy metal and a hot piece hit me in the eye. The base doctor Captain Bean patched my eye then made arrangements for me to fly to Korat, Thailand and the 31<sup>st</sup> Field Hospital. They examined me and put me on a C-130 to fly to Clark, AFB. This flight landed in DaNang, Vietnam before proceeding to Clark AFB. I was examined there and was forwarded via C-141 to a hospital in Tachikawa, Japan. After eye test and examinations that took approximately 4 weeks I was released to return to Ubon and told to check with Base Operations for return flight. I do not know for sure if this flight landed in Vietnam on the return trip but I do know we did fly over Vietnam.
